

This session will focus on the mechanics of ultrasonography and will specifically demonstrate the technique involved in ultrasounding the respiratory system on live calves. Dr. Ollivett will also share results from several recent studies on the use of portable ultrasonography for diagnosing respiratory disease in dairy calves. Additionally, she will discuss proper drug injection sites and proper and improper vaccination sites.
