

Printed in 2006, the original run of 200 copies for friends and family didn't meet the demand. Since then, his parents have sold more than 60,000 copies of the book.

John's award-winning "Live Inspired" podcast has more than 2.5 million downloads and enjoys world-class guests like Brene Brown, Mitch Albom and Shawn Achor. 



Communicating dairy sustainability

As sustainability becomes increasingly important in the dairy industry, this study examines how to more effectively communicate sustainability messages to dairy farmers. Through interviews with 25 communication and sustainability professionals from cooperatives, trade groups and other dairy organizations, three key themes emerged for successful outreach: emphasize economic viability, tailor messages to farmers' specific priorities and contexts, and build trust through consistent messaging and shared values. - Dr. Bret Shaw, PhD & Grace Krahm

Corn silage, cover crops and nitrogen

Wisconsin annually grows about 4 million acres of corn, with 20% harvested as corn silage. Research at the Arlington Agricultural Research Station found that using a winter rye cover crop in corn silage systems doesn't reduce silage yield, unlike corn for grain, which experiences a yield drag. Current nitrogen recommendations for silage are based on corn grain systems and haven't been verified when manure and cover crops are used. Colostrum, gut health and long-term outcomes

Obesity is a major global human health problem; research shows that the gut microbiome plays a big role. Antibiotics given early in life, especially macrolides commonly used for respiratory infections, can disrupt these gut bacteria and raise our obesity risk and metabolic issues later on. This study tested if bovine colostrum could help restore healthy gut bacteria after early antibiotic use. Researchers found that young animals receiving pasteurized bovine colostrum had less body fat gain even on a high-fat diet, increased beneficial gut bacteria in such as *Akkermansia* (which supports gut health) and improved gut-immune activity.

Effects of processing colostrum on calf health

Newborn calves rely entirely on colostrum to develop immunity and resist disease. While colostrum management typically focuses on IgG transfer, emerging research shows that live immune cells in fresh colostrum also play a critical role in early immune development. This study examines how freezing colostrum impacts these cells and calf health outcomes with the goal of refining colostrum-management guidelines to strengthen immunity, reduce disease and antibiotic use, and improve animal welfare.
