**Dr. Allan Gray, PhD,** is the executive director of both the Center for Food and Agricultural Business and the Digital Innovation in Agri-food systems laboratory. As Land O'Lakes Chair in Food and Agribusiness, he works with food and agribusiness managers worldwide to provide industry insights and facilitate strategy implementation.

He teaches professional development seminars and workshops at Purdue University's Center for Food and Agricultural Business; he also teaches strategic agribusiness management in undergrad and graduate programs.



**Dr. David Kohl, PhD,** is a professor emeritus of Agricultural Finance and Small Business Management and Entrepreneurship at Virginia Tech, Blacksburg, Va. Having taught more than 10,000 students at Virginia Tech and Cornell University, Dr. Kohl currently energizes agricultural lenders, producers and businesspeople

with his keen insight gained through extensive travel, research and exposure during his career. Over the years, he's traveled over 10 million miles, conducted more than 7,000 workshops and 500 webinars for ag audiences and published more than 2,500 articles. In 2017, he was inducted into the Virginia Tech College of Agriculture and Life Sciences Hall of Fame. Dr. Kohl continues to write for many leading publications; his personal involvement with agriculture and interaction with key industry players provide a unique perspective into future trends of the agricultural industry and economy.



**Dr. Ed Seifried, PhD,** is a professor emeritus of Economics and Business at Lafayette College and has led educational programs as Dean of the West Virginia Banking School and the Virginia School of Banking. He has been on the faculty of many banking schools, including Stonier and the Graduate School of Banking at

Louisiana State University. He's currently Executive Director of the Sheshunoff Affiliation Program, a highly acclaimed program providing education and idea exchanges for community bank CEOs, lenders and technology/operations officers. Having served as a community bank director, Dr. Seifried believes one must experience the dynamics of being a community bank director to fully understand their needs to create the bank's strategic plan, assess risk, set risk parameters and monitor risk.
