General Sessions

What's up with disease resurgence?

Dairy herds are seeing a spike in disease; is this due to disease mutations or lapses in vaccinations? Or are we simply more aware? Lean into the discussion with **Dr. Curt Vlietstra, DVM**, as he tackles the complex topic of disease resurgence – giving particular attention to Bovine Viral Diarrhea. Explore effects of this potentially costly disease beyond the persistently infected calf; how does BVD impact the immune systems and growth of young stock?

Producer panel: Lessons learned

With boots-on-the-ground experience, two Wisconsin calf raisers – **Sherry Arnold of Busse's Barron Acres** in Barron and **Heather Jauquet of Synergy Dairy** in Pulaski – provide a virtual walk-through of their facilities. They'll share lessons learned, challenges encountered and remedies discovered regarding facilities, nutrition, seasonal challenges and other management methods. Discover the do's, don'ts, advantages and disadvantages of a number of calf-raising options and philosophies, including raising calves in hutches, group housing, using computerized feeders, and more.

Manage milk for consistent nutrition

Calf necropsy: Get under their skin

– Dr. Vicky Lauer, DVM

Pull on your gloves and join Dr. Vicky as she guides you through the inside of the calf. See for yourself what affects a calf under its hide and how to manage and care for the youngest in your herd. Setting the stage for healthy digestive and respiratory systems in your calves, this hands-on lab will clarify proper and improper vaccinating approaches, appropriate drug-injection techniques and correct tubing of calves.
