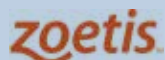

MORNING GENERAL SESSIONS | POWER ROUND

• Transition Cow

The changes occurring at three weeks pre-fresh and three weeks post-partum mark significant turning points in the productive cycles of your cows from one lactation to the next. The complex physiological, metabolic and nutritional transformations each cow undergoes is further impacted by the way the changes occur and how they are managed – and all these changes are closely linked to production, clinical and subclinical postpartum diseases, and reproductive performance.

Dr. Julia Hamann, DVM, will take an in-depth look at the metabolic changes happening to cows before, during and after calving. Research has revealed we may be mismanaging or misdiagnosing the cows' needs. Dr. Julia will zero in on ways to improve the health, safety and longevity of every cow in your herd.

• Cow Necropsy

Dr. Franklyn Garry, DVM, will elevate your cow-side manner to the next level. He'll lead you through a full cow necropsy section by section to discover firsthand the physiology of abomasum ulcers, hemorrhagic bowel, fatty liver and other silent thieves. In addition, Dr. Garry will highlight when euthanasia is appropriate and outline the proper methods to perform it with the welfare of people and animals in mind.

• Obstetrics

Dr. Ryan Breuer, DVM
This session offers practical insights to those managing close-up and maternity pens. This hands-on training will cover the how and why of first-rate maternity care by addressing the following:

- Signs to watch for before, during and after delivery
- Indications of distress during calving using the hands-on-simulation model
- Protocols for safe, healthy calf deliveries
- Identifying various birthing scenarios and determining when to assist
- Safe handling practices for handler and cow
