- -- Computer work editing cows sold, calved, dried up, etc.;
- -- Visit and enjoy good conversation;
- -- Accurately collect milk samples and coordinating cow identification;
- -- Properly identify vials that need diagnostic testing (i.e. milk-pregnancy test, A1/A2, etc.)
- -- Wash DHI-testing equipment;
- -- Computer work to check for errors, ensure accuracy, and transfer data to laboratory;
- -- Invoice customer using company program;
- -- Organize shipping or delivery (depending on location) of vials to laboratory for component and diagnostic testing;
- -- Schedule future DHI milk-testing days; and
- -- Once lab work is complete, assist customer in analyzing test-day data and reports to help with herd management.
- -- DHI Specialists also spend time with our A.I./genetics business unit working together to prospect and grow business.
